



SVdP Scholarship Opportunity

The St. Vincent de Paul Society (SVdP) of Lincoln and Weston is pleased to offer educational scholarships to mature, motivated adults in need of financial support who live or work for at least 20 hours in Lincoln and Weston, or whose children attend the public schools in either town. The goals of this program are to increase skills levels in order to enter or return to the workforce; to change career direction by strengthening employable skills; or to become more valuable to one's employer. The awards vary in size from \$100 to \$2,000 and must be activated within six months from the award date.

Please describe your interest, need, and type of program.

No special application form is required, but we will need the following information.

- Your name and address
- Name of student (if different)
- Area of study and reason for the choice
- Course(s) and institution for which scholarship is requested and dates course(s) start and end.
- Cost of tuition and any other required course materials for which support is requested
- Name and address of office to which payment should be sent and student ID number if any

Awards will be offered on a rolling basis depending on the availability of funds. For more details about the scholarship program, see below.

- Scholarship support for tuition is paid to the educational institution, not to the student.
- All support is paid upfront to enable pursuit of the goals of the program without financial hardship. In other words, this program is not a tuition reimbursement program where you are reimbursed only upon completion.
- Students advancing from high school to college are not eligible, nor are students pursuing Master's level work and above normally eligible.
- Previous recipients are eligible to apply again. Evidence of satisfactory completion of previous SVdP-Supported coursework will usually be required.
